The Facilities Maintenance Technician works under general supervision to maintain company-wide electrical systems and equipment. This role is responsible for troubleshooting and repairing electrical systems and equipment on assignments of varying difficulty. Using good judgment, the Facilities Maintenance Technician will ensure all work is completed safely and meets building code requirements.

## ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Troubleshoot and repair existing company-wide electrical systems and equipment safely with 480VAC, 277VAC, 120VAC, ensuring maintenance is completed in a safe and timely manner
- Maintain, repair, and replace motors, pumps, motor controls, HVAC control components, production support equipment, broken bolts, bearings, shafts, belting, and electrical components as required
- Maintain and repair the facility structural, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems and controls
- Perform preventive maintenance operations such as electrical inspections, lubrication, cleaning, and mechanical inspections. This includes at times replacing fan belts, cleaning sumps and wye strainers, and inspecting cabinets for loose connections, etc.
- Work with and understand facility blueprints, mechanical and electrical drawings, or rough sketches to complete assignments for installations and troubleshooting
- Responsible for company compliance with federal, state and local electrical codes and regulations
- Perform regular electrical safety inspections, documenting results. Follows-up on inspection results, making corrections which meet National Electrical Code safety standards and requirements.
- Complete daily progress reports on assigned work orders, documenting completed assignments while updating work in process using MS Window based computer software programs
- Assist with the completion of feasibility studies for Facilities projects
- Assist Facilities Technicians, as required, to complete non-electrical tasks as required to meet customer needs
- Respond to on-call maintenance requests outside of regular working hours

## EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- High school diploma, GED, or equivalent education and experience is required; Associates Degree in a related field preferred
- State of Oregon Electricians license, required; Journeyman Electrical license, preferred
- Minimum 5 years electrical maintenance experience
- Ability to evaluate and troubleshoot electrical systems, controls, and components, making corrections as required
- Good knowledge of building and equipment maintenance including mechanical, electrical, hydraulic, waste water treatment, and pneumatic equipment operation and maintenance
- Understanding of building, environmental, and industry equipment regulatory codes and administration
- Strong knowledge and consistent application of electrical codes and regulations
- Good written and verbal communication skills including technical documentation skills
- Strong mechanical skills including knowledge of and ability to use machine, hand, amp meters, DMM, and power tools
- Demonstrated time management, project management, and prioritization skills
